
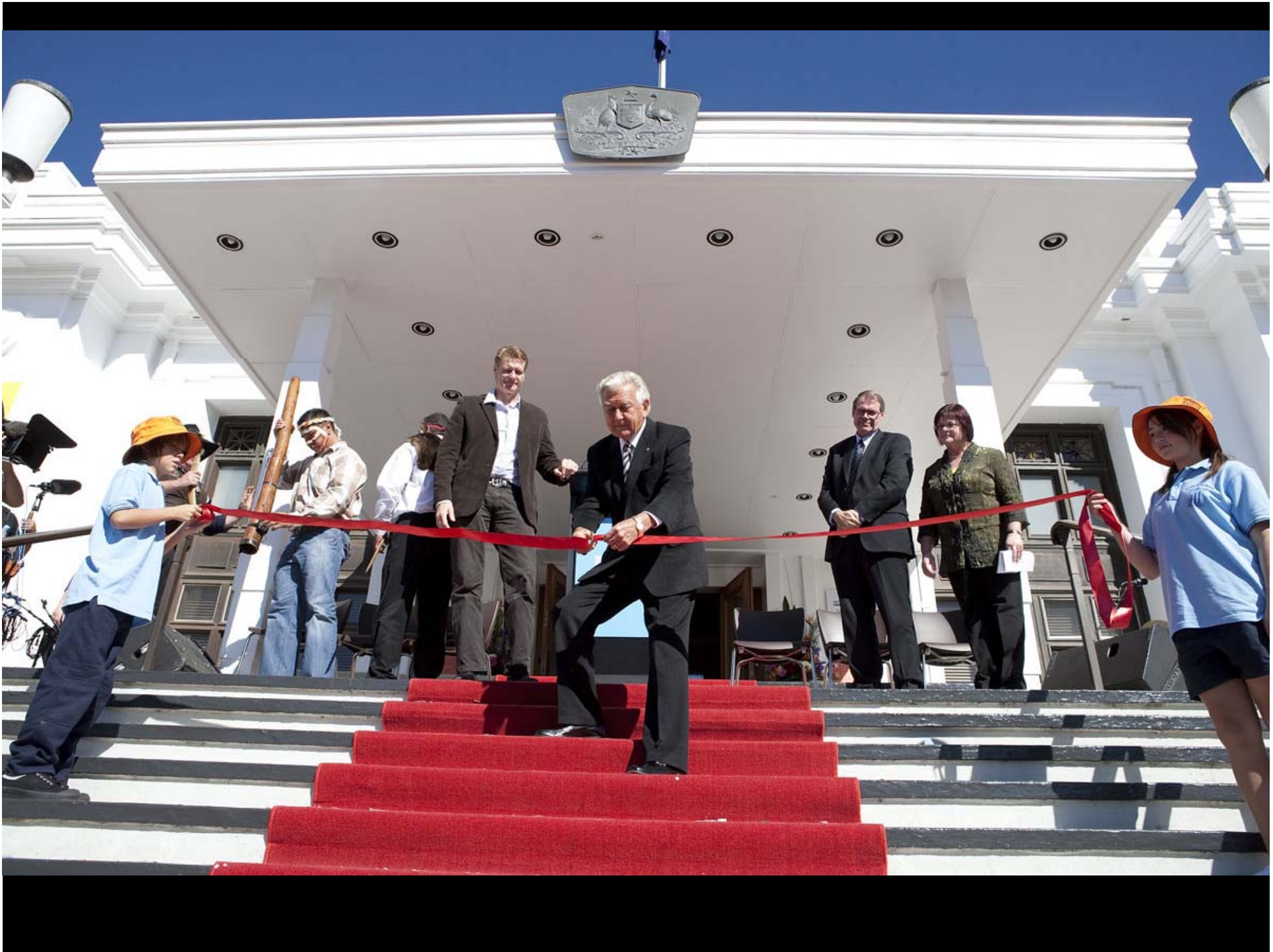

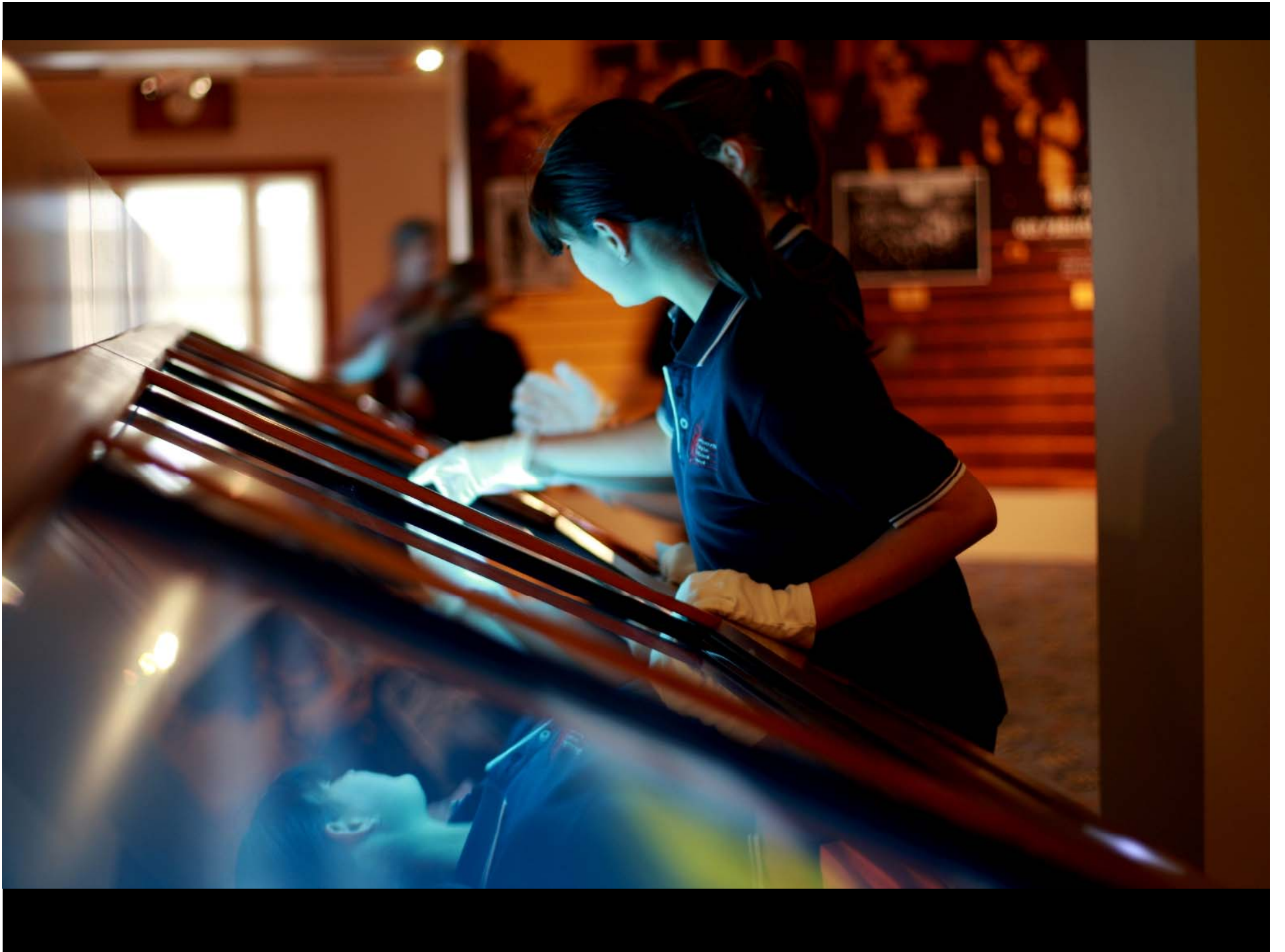

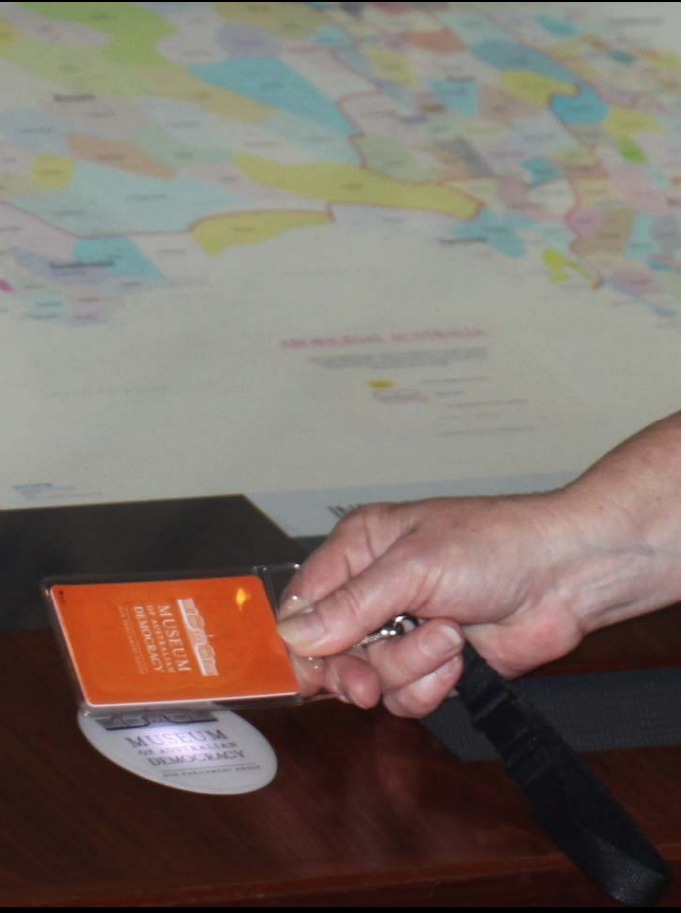

Next to you is a statue of a Scottish rebel, Thomas Muir.
(1765-1799)



He was found guilty and sentenced to 14 years' transportation to Australia. His sentence provoked anger across Britain but the Home Secretary, Henry Dundas, wanted to make an example of Mair and the other leaders, who later became known as the 'Scottish Martyrs'.

British settlers and local inhabitants was often defined by conflict and non-recognition of Aboriginal laws and practices.
